Course rating is a very important part of the USGA Handicap System and is used in calculating a golfer's handicap index. A course rating of 74.8, for example, means that scratch golfers are expected to post an average score of 74.8 playing from that set of tees on that golf course.

Course Ratings In Golf: What the USGA Number Means

Course rating tells scratch golfers how difficult the golf course will be; slope rating tells bogey golfers how difficult it will be. To put it another way: USGA Course Rating tells the best golfers how hard a golf course actually plays; USGA Slope Rating indicates how much harder the course plays for "regular" (meaning not among the best) golfers. The minimum slope rating is 55 and the maximum is 155 (slope does not relate specifically to strokes played as course rating does). The higher ...

Yes. It's the United States Golf Association (USGA) Course Rating System™. The course rating measures the relative difficulty of a golf course. The higher the course rating (expressed as a number such as 69.7), the more difficult the golf course. In other words, golfers would be expected to shoot a higher score on a golf course with a course rating of 73.1 than a golf course with a course rating of 69.7. The USGA defines course rating as follows:

The purpose of "The USGA Course Rating System" is to offer a "textbook" on the USGA Course Rating System. The USGA Course Rating System, including Slope Rating, was implemented by the USGA on January 1, 1987, as a refinement of the existing USGA Handicap System. This system assists in addressing the problem of portability of handicaps by adjusting a player's Handicap Index according to the relative difficulty of the golf course being played. All courses rated under the USGA Course Rating System are rated using the same parameters that have been established by the USGA. A male scratch player is defined by the USGA as an amateur golfer who has reached the stroke play portion of the U.S. Amateur Championship. On average, he hits his tee shot 225 yards in the air with 25 yards of roll.

Course Rating, (Standard) Scratch Score, Scratch Rating, and Standard Rating are largely equivalent ratings that are used to indicate the average "good score" by a scratch golfer for a set of tees on a golf course. For a par 72 course, the course rating is generally between 67 and 77.

The USGA Slope Rating is a numerical value that indicates the relative difficulty of a set of tees on a golf course for a bogey golfer in comparison to a scratch golfer. It describes the fact that when playing on a more difficult course, the scores of higher-handicapped players will rise more quickly than those of lower handicapped golfers.
