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Health And Social Care Assessment

It identifies what kind of care and support would help you, such as a paid carer or meals delivered to your home (meals on wheels). Paying for care. You'll generally be expected to pay toward the cost of social care. If the assessment identifies you need help, you will have a financial assessment (means test) to see if the council will pay towards it.

Needs assessments and carers' assessments | Local ...

The first stage in getting any social care is for the local authority to assess your needs, called a needs assessment. This is so the local authority (local council) can gain a full picture of what kinds of care and support needs you have, so they can make informed decisions about whether you're eligible for support.
